CMMC L1 Assessments Available for Indiana Defense Industrial Base (DIB) Companies

Indiana Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC), part of the Indiana Economic Development Corporation (IEDC), is partnering with Purdue MEP to fund a total of \$100,000 in CMMC Level 1 assessments and implementation. CMMC stands for "Cybersecurity Maturity Model Certification" and is a unifying standard for the implementation of cybersecurity across the Defense Industrial Base (DIB).

This opportunity is perfect for small-to-medium-sized companies in the DIB that need support to adopt foundational cyber practices and are unable to participate in the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) contracting realm without it. The purpose is to strengthen and support local businesses while increasing defense revenue growth in the State of Indiana.

Who is eligible?

Small to medium-sized companies in the Indiana Defense Industrial Base (DIB).

Why is it necessary?

To be a U.S. Department of Defense contractor, you must adopt certain foundational cyber practices.

What do they get?

CMMC Level 1 assessments and some implementation.

What is the cost?

It's free to you! PTAC is funding up to a total of \$100,000 in assessments with some implementation.

When is it available?

Now through October 2022 - or until funding runs out.
